March 24, 1928 - March 10, 2023

Annette Edmonson, eighteen days shy of her ninety-fifth birthday, entered into eternal life in her sleep, on Friday morning, March 10, 2023. Annette was a faithful servant of Christ, loving mother, grandmother and dear friend to many.

She will be laid to rest with her husband, the late Richard B. Edmonson, at DFW National Cemetery at 10 a.m., Tuesday, March 21, 2023. A Celebration of Life will follow at 1 p.m. at First Baptist Church of Grand Prairie, Dr. Bill Skaar officiating, where she served as a Sunday School teacher and was a member for more than sixty-three years. Visitation for family and friends will be prior to the Memorial Service.

Annette H. Edmonson was born on March 24, 1928, the eldest of 2 children and the daughter of the late Charles Holveck and the late Daisy Wammack Holveck. She was born in Florence Hill, Texas, a community that was engulfed and is now a part of Joe Poole Lake. She was raised in Grand Prairie, where she attended schools and was the last surviving member of the Grand Prairie High School, class of 1945. She would meet the late Richard B. Edmonson of Van, Texas, whom she would marry in 1947 and remain so until his death on September 11, 2016.

Always a hard worker, Annette would retire from LTV after twenty-two years of employment. Her final years working were spent in the Personnel Records

Division. She relished the time she had with her family, camping and fishing at their property in Hubbard, Texas. She and Richard loved spending time with family and friends, enjoying the solitude of country life. As she aged, the grandchildren and great-grandchildren took more of her time and attention.
