Austen Trevor Hart, 38, passed away, Wednesday, April 2, 2025, in Grand Prairie, Texas.

He was born August 8, 1986, in Bedford, Texas, to parents, Tom and Susan Hart.

Austen lived a life full of heart, faith, and fearless adventure. He left this world far too soon, but he left it better than he found it—through the way he loved, the way he gave, and the way he lived without holding back.

Austen was a devoted Christian whose faith guided every step he took. He didn't just talk about love—he lived it. He poured himself into his family, his friends, his community. But at the very center of his heart were his children—his son Ryley, his best bud and closest companion, and his daughter Ellie, the light of his life. He cherished every moment with them, and his love for them ran deeper than words could ever express. Being their dad was his greatest honor, and they were his proudest joy.

He loved the thrill of adventure. Whether he was carving through fresh snow on a ski slope, paddling across a quiet lake, riding his motorcycle with the wind in his face, or diving deep into the ocean, Austen felt most at home in the wild, wide-open world. He had a scuba trip planned for August, another

adventure he was counting down the days for.

Austen had a heart for animals, a deep love that showed in how gently and instinctively he cared for them. He was a natural in the kitchen, too—cooking was one of his favorite ways to connect with others, to create moments that lingered long after the meal was done.

He worked closely with his dad on projects that helped shape the city of Grand Prairie. He was proud of that work, proud to be part of something meaningful, something lasting. And he didn't just work hard—he gave of himself, generously and without hesitation. If someone needed help, Austen showed up.

He loved deeply, laughed freely, and stood strong. Like his father, and alongside his brother Tavis, he completed the Outward Bound program in Utah—an experience that matched his spirit of grit, growth, and courage. He was a fighter in every sense. Even in life's hardest moments, he held his ground and pushed forward with quiet strength.

Austen had a way of making everyone feel like they mattered. He gave his love freely, and he received just as much in return. His friends adored him, and that love was mutual and true.

He leaves behind a legacy of faith, family, and fearless living. We'll miss his warmth, his wisdom, and his spark—but we'll carry his spirit with us always, in every mountain climbed, every meal shared, every act of kindness.

Austen is preceded in death by his brother; Travis Hart, grandparents; Peg and Bill Skinner, and Marilyn and Gene Hart; uncle, Mike Skinner.
