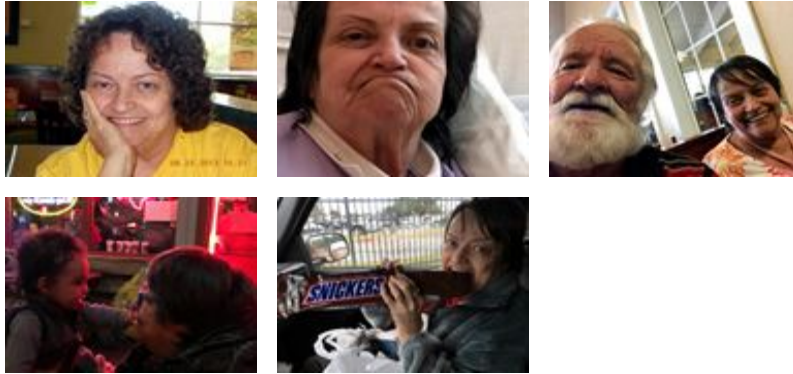

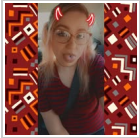

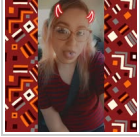

So many memories of Bonnie she was a second mom to me when growing up. I loved her laugh and learned to be goofy as well. I believe her spirt lives in me today ❤️

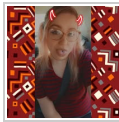
