Celia was born on November 22, 1939 in Monclova, Mexico. Raised as an orphan after the age of 9, Celia would marry Pedro Delgado in 1954, and live in Monterrey, Mexico. In 1968, Pedro would be hired to work for Ford Motor Company in Detroit, Michigan where they would raise their family.

Celia prided herself in maintaining a traditional home, which always included family, friends, music, and food but in her own special way. She was an avid gardener, creative hand embroider, an artist as a dressmaker, and an expert cook. As one of the earliest Mexicans families in Southwest Detroit, she was proud to pass on to younger generations the art of making homemade chorizo, tamales, mole, and her use of natural remedies. Her family recalls her love of song, tireless and endless energy, always in her garden, cooking and caring for her family.

In 1991, because of health reasons, Pedro and Celia would move to the Dallas area. Her family will miss her smile, strength, unconditional and faithful

love.
