



Charles Franklin Bowen Sr.

August 15, 1940 - July 14, 2018

Charles F. Bowen Sr., 77, a native of Texas, a resident of Grand Prairie, and a missionary of Ecuador, passed away peacefully July 14, 2018, in his home with family by his side.

He was born on August 15, 1940 in Post, Texas to the late Thomas Oscar Bowen and the late Nanny Bess Kee.

After high school, Charles would attend Arlington Baptist College, and in 1962 graduated with degrees in Music and Divinity. During this time he would meet the love of his life, Juanita Faye Scott, whom he would marry in 1960 and raise 4 wonderful children.

Charles served as a missionary for more than 35 years in Ecuador. He loved to sing, and often his teachings on the mission field would include lessons in leading and conducting worship. In 2015, Charles received an Honorary Doctoral Degree from the Arlington Baptist College.

During his time in Ecuador Charles would join the Masonic Lodge and become a Master Mason for more than 30 years. He was also a member of Calvary Baptist Church where he and his family were members. Charles was a great man, he loved his family, he loved his friends, but more importantly he loved his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Charles is preceded in death by his brother David Bowen. He is survived by his wife of almost 58 years Juanita Bowen; son, Charles Bowen and wife Melynn; daughter, Faith Hunt and husband Wes; son, Thomas Bowen and wife Ennie; son, David Bowen and wife Rebecca; sister-in-law, Donna Bowen; 13 grandchildren, 4 great-grandchildren, 2 nieces, and numerous cousins.

I quickly added that Daddy wasn't home, but would be soon and I couldn't let him leave, Daddy would be so upset if he missed him. You see, Daddy and Momma always spoke so highly of Bro. Charles and Juanita. They always spoke of them just like that too, like Peanut butter & jelly, Charles & Juanita. I had heard so many stories, I felt like I knew them. I definitely knew that Daddy would be really upset if he missed seeing this jolly man, that he referred to as his friend, which was a big deal, because Daddy had acquaintances, but not a lot of friends. We chatted while we waited, like old friends. We talked about my adoption, about a possum that got hit in front of our house, that Bro. Charles was happy to take off their hands, I think what he actually said was "Put on the swate taters, I'm on my way". After lots of laughter and recounting of stories, we heard Daddy pull up. Daddy came in the house, around the corner into the living room, no doubt to see whose car was parked outside, but when he saw Bro. Charles, his old friend, he started to cry. I had not often, if ever at that point, seen my Daddy cry, I learned that when George Lowande cried, I cried, but watching the two old friends hug and shed tears, well, at 48 years old, I'm still recanting verbatim, if that tells you how it affected me. I learned a few things that day. First, my Daddy was a softy, next, Christian friendship lasts a lifetime, lastly, that Bro. Charles Bowen was everything Momma and Daddy said he was, a wonderful, witty, precious Godly man. It was my pleasure to see he and Juanita several times throughout the subsequent years and get to know them myself. I am thankful for those times and for the Blessing that this man truly was, to all of those who knew him. Love you Juanita. Praying for you always.

And so it was that shortly thereafter they began planning to go to Ecuador. It was so hard to see them go off with Charlie, Faith Ann and Tommy (David was born a few years later). We, John, Jean, Becky and David, enjoyed a wonderful time visiting them in Quito in 1976. We took them a typewriter with a few Spanish keys which they could use in the works there. Getting off the plane was a new experience as we were met by armed soldiers of a military run country. One morning during our first week in the Bowen's home we noticed some people sitting across the street looking at their house. Bro. Bowen explained they were Ecuadorians who had walked some distance to hear the Word from him. We visited 3 different works the Bowens had started prior to our visit. One was Dos Rios, a small village where the people had gathered together waiting for the service to begin. After introducing us, Bro. Bowen asked John & I if we could sing one of our choruses to the group. We had barely started and suddenly there was a donkey poking his head through the window opening which bellowed: "Hee Haw, hee haw" and everyone began laughing, including us. We could not finish the chorus. Another day we went down the coast to Atacamas, the kids went swimming and suddenly Tommy and our David were being taken farther out in the water by the tides and John went in and brought them closer to the shore. How God watches over us. We also went up to Mt. Cotopaxie and saw tiny black frogs in the streams and groups of wild horses running free on the mountain. It's such a beautiful country. We enjoyed many other experiences there, coffee plantations, enjoying an invitation from a couple in Dos Rios to have coffee, etc. with them following the service. So the kids, Charlie, Faith Ann, Becky, Tommy and David all enjoyed their time together again as much as we did with Charles and Juanita. They gave us experiences we'll remember forever. Many more that space limits. Juanita, we loved hearing you both sing either separate or together. He is gone from us for a time, but we know that one day we will all be reunited and live forever with our Savior and Heavenly Father, praising Him for His love and forgiveness.
