We are sad to announce the passing of Charlie.

Charles David Smith, 86, loving husband, father and grandfather passed away on Friday, August 5, 2022 in an Arlington, Texas hospital surrounded by loved ones.

Charles David Smith was born on February 3, 1936, the youngest of three children born to the late William Harry Smith Sr. and the late Mabel Clara Lewis Smith in Coconut Grove, Florida. He would join the Air Force as a young man, serving during the Korean War in Japan and various bases stateside. After his four years of service, he would graduate from the University of Miami where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. Charlie married Joyce May Wells on Sept. 9, 1960 in Fort Lauderdale, Florida amid Hurricane Donna.

His college education would lead him on a 36 year path of employment with the Aerospace Defense Industry. Charlie and family moved to Grand Prairie, TX in 1968. Many of Charlie's hobbies include storytelling, whistling, fishing,

camping, writing his books, playing golf and an all around Mr. Fix-It. He would retire in 1999 to enjoy life with his wife and family. He was also a long-time member of First United Methodist Church of Grand Prairie, TX.

Survivors: beloved wife of 62 years, Joyce Wells Smith; daughter, Martha Sue Smith D'Brass and spouse Peter; son, Steven Lewis Smith and partner, Brian Molski; grandson, Jordan William Palmer and his spouse Kristine.

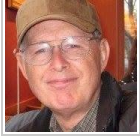
