Charlie enjoyed his early years spending time with his brother, sisters and neighborhood friends around the town of Wichita Falls, frequenting a nearby fishing hole and swimming pool in the summer and listening to westerns and comic book hero stories by radio when weather prevented outdoor play. He also spoke of trips his family took to visit his Uncle Lewis's farm and the fun his family had there. He graduated from the Wichita Falls Highschool.

He enlisted for the US Army Reserves in 1948. Trained M-1 and M-16 marksman and transport vehicle mechanic. Called to active duty for the Cold War, Berlin Wall. Following the cold war active duty, he served in the National Guard Reserves for several more years. Retired as Sgt Charles Richard Tarr in 1971 after 23 years.

Charlie worked for Aviall, a Boeing company, starting out as a clerk and worked his way to an aerospace machinist. He retired from Aviall after many years of service.

Charlie was a modest simple easy-going guy who enjoyed simple pleasures in life. Gatherings with family and friends, fishing and outdoor activities and a good old game of dominos with anyone who would play. He was a person who always put others above self. The patience of Job with a content spirit. He was an animal lover throughout his life, showing compassion, concern and spirit of stewardship for them.
