David excelled in this position while based at Fort Hood, receiving several honors, and completed his term in the military as a team leader while based in Germany. Once returning to the States, David, as his father, embarked upon a 20 plus year career with the electric company, known then as TP&L and later TXU. While there, he promoted to many positions, but more importantly built friendships that would endure the remainder of his life.

Many hours of laughter could be spent reminiscing about their championship baseball teams, bowling league, chili cook offs, and fishing trips to Lake Creek.

Following his time at TXU, David returned to his officer training background and took a position as a correctional officer where he remained until his illness required him to retire home to his loved ones. 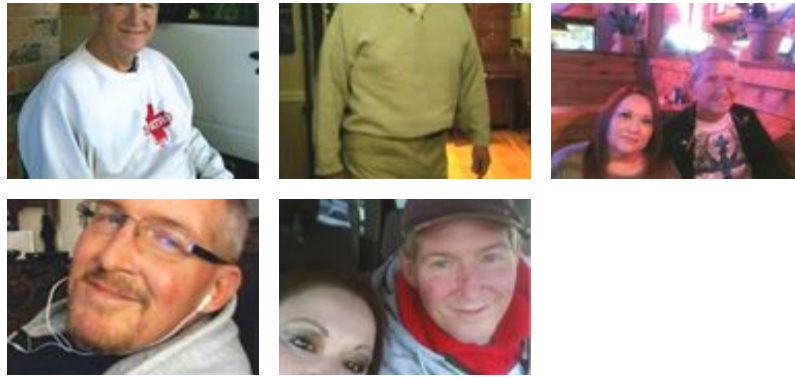
