Eileen Sue Beaverson Turner, 80, a retired Tarrant County jailer, passed away on Sunday, September 4, 2016 in Fort Worth, Texas.

Eileen Sue Turner was born on April 1, 1936, in Fulton County Ohio. She is preceded in death by her husband Gerald Turner and Ex Husband Roger Echler who remained a friend. She was the daughter of the late Earl C. Beaverson and the late Ilva Viola Snyder Beaverson, a local farming family. After her graduation, she would become one of the first female bus drivers for the Anthony Wayne School District. She would complete her nursing program and work many years for The Sunshine Children's Home.

In 1981, she would move to the Fort Worth area, working for the Tarrant County Sheriff's Department. She started as a nurse in the medical area of the program and finally retired as a jailer.

Eileen loved the outdoors. When younger, she enjoyed the opportunity to spend time camping, and fishing.

Eileen Sue Beaverson Echler Turner, 80, a retired Tarrant County Deputy Sherrif, passed away on Sunday, September 4th, 2016 in Fort Worth, TX.

Eileen Sue Turner was born on April 1st, 1936 in Futon County Ohio to Earl and Ilva Beaverson, a local farming family. After graduation she married Roger Lee Echler from Montpelier, OH. In 1958 they moved to Whitehouse where she would mow lawns for the school system and fostered 2 girls, Joyce and Margaret Miller. The school would later ask her to become the first woman school bus driver.

In 1966 she would be attending nursing school and would become a nurse for Sunshine Children's Home for many years. In 1981 she moved to Texas with Gerald Turner and got her nursing license with the state of Texas and soon was working in the County jails as a nurse.

When the county outsourced their nursing department they offered her a deputy Sherrif position if she could pass the test. She became a Tarrant Country Deputy Sherrif at that time and retired from that position in the early 2000s.

Eileen loved the outdoors and would spend many years camping and fishing with friends and family. She also loved her gnomes.

Proceeding her in death were her mom and dad, 4 brothers: Marimon, Jon, James, and Harvey and her husband Gerald Turner.
