Freddie "Fred" Lyles Brown Jr., 64, died on Wednesday, May 20, 2015 at a local hospital.

Freddie Lyles Brown, Jr., of Grand Prairie Texas died on Wednesday, May 20, 2015 in North Richland Hills, Texas from a heart attack while recovering from surgery on his leg.

He was born on February 1, 1951 in Salt Lake City, Utah to Fred and Macksene Brown. His wonderful sense of humor and playfulness helped him to make friends quickly even though his family moved numerous times throughout the United States as he grew up. He was very outgoing and enjoyed playing different sports, especially basketball.

He met his future wife, Alice, at a church dance in Dallas, while he was home from college. After their meeting, he left to serve a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Washington state. This time left an indelible mark on him and led him to continue to serve in the church and the community throughout his life.

He and Alice were married in the Salt Lake Temple on June 6, 1973. They raised ten children (eight eagle scouts, one marine, seven full-time missionaries, and two amazing mothers) with humor, hard work, and love, living the early years in Orlando, Florida, for a brief time in Tennessee and then finally settling in Grand Prairie.

He was well respected through his career by colleagues and competitors alike. He was a true entrepreneur. He loved to build businesses and his varied interests led him through many different fields - from toy sales and satellite dish installs, to a non-alcoholic nightclub ("Scatz is where it's at") and finally "growing up" in financial services. He didn't really grow up though; he was still the most popular DJ around.

He held many roles in business, but his favorite titles were husband, dad and grandpa. He was never happier than when spearheading some adventure or especially when instigating mischief among a group of his 24 grandchildren.

Fred is survived by his wife Alice, his children Freddie (III), Benjamin, Abraham, Emily (Kane), Isaac, Jacob, Valerie (Anderson), Aaron, and Adam; also his mother Macksene Brown. He was predeceased by his father Freddie Lyles Brown, Sr.
