James Tilbury Nutter known to many as “Grandpa Buck” of Plano, Texas passed away on the morning of Tuesday May 26th, 2026. Born on August 24, 1940 in Bridgeport Connecticut.

James was a devout Christian and a frequent attendee of Oak Stone Christian Church in Allen, Texas. As anyone who has ever met him knows, James was an extrovert. He loved people.
