February 14, 1918 - July 26, 2016

Janice Murlene Kendrick Haley, age 98, went to be with her Lord at 11:45 pm on July 26, 2016. She passed peacefully in the loving company of her daughter Rue Ann, grandsons Lelan Haley and Travis Haley, and great granddaughter Carson Haley at Mansfield Methodist Hospital. She had resided close to family, at the Pavilion at Creekwood in Mansfield, Texas.

Janice was born on February 14, 1918 in Bluffton, Arkansas, to parents Etta and Edd Kendrick. She was a Valley girl from her childhood years, when she moved with her parents to Harlingen, Texas. There she attended elementary and high school, and the family moved to Hargrill when Janice was a teen. She met the Haley clan in Hargrill, and her first date with future husband, Justus Haley, was on horseback. Sons Dean and Ray were born in Hargrill, and daughter Rue Ann was born in Edinburg. Janice resided in either Hargrill or Edinburg until she moved to the Austin area in 2006. In April of 2016, she moved to Mansfield, Texas, where she lived until she went to be with the Lord.

Janice was a lifelong member of either the Hargrill First Baptist Church or Edinburg First Baptist. She taught school as a substitute teacher and was bookkeeper at the First State Bank in Edinburg, Texas.
