“ I am one of Steve’s cousin. I was with Silda Wynn during the day of her open heart surgery and many weeks stay in the post open heart unit at Baylor Grapevine, working PRN as an Nurse. We visited often in those weeks I was working night shifts in the same ICU. I was also on duty the night she passed away. I called Steve to tell him she had coded and did not survive. A week before Silda had told me, “Steve is my Rock.” As a long time Nurse, God has placed patients and families in my path and most were not just “Coincidence.” Just like this time I was called by my mother to tell me, “Silda has had a bad heart attack, and to pray for her.” I heard that message as I dressed to take my first night shift at Baylor Grapevine in their ICU. The charge nurse showed me around the unit and gave me a tour around the unit. We only walked into one room that night. The patient was a “ Fresh Open Heart” She was on a ventilator and sedated. I did not recognize that patient was Silda, my oldest cousins ex wife. I heard her nurse read off her name on the unit of blood she was about to hang. She said Silda, and I said, “Is this Silda Wynn? It was a real, “God thing” that I had been assigned to the same unit on the same night she had open heart. I thanked God for this miracle and was glad to be with her many nights while she was there. I of course could not be her assigned nurse, but my patients were next to her room. I kept up on her progress every shift and visited her when she was still awake. The whole time I was cognizant of the complications she was fighting and prayed with her several times during those weeks. I felt honored to be there at this critical time. On my last assigned PRN shift; I heard the Code Blue alarm and was the first into her room. This was the first time I had ever done CPR on a close relative. I went into that Code Nurse roll but was also praying and praying for her to respond. This. Code was worst than all the rest because I could not help be concerned for Steve and their 2 girls. We worked for almost one hour but never got any response from all the drugs, CPR, blood... Afterwords, I kept asking God, why her, why now, why me? After Steve and the girls got there, it was abundantly clear to me; why me, why then and why this. I know it was no “Coincidence” that I was assigned this ICU at this time, with all the

hundreds of ICU's beds I could have been assigned to in DFW during that several weeks and my last night shift was there with Silda, Steve, Britney and Katie. I have retired this last 6 months but there are several obvious "Non Coincidences" in my 43 years as a nurse. As I grieve the loss of my passion for Nursing, I thank God for all the Blessings I have been honored to experience and Miracles I have witnessed first hand. RIP Steve, you and Silda are together again. Thank the Lord.
