



Kenneth Irving Dailey II

Kenneth Irving Dailey II, 67, a resident of Irving, died September 25, 2010 in Arlington, Texas. Kenneth was a native of Canton, New York, the son of the late Kenneth Irving Dailey and the late Jean Elizabeth Neusliouski. He attended schools in Syracuse, graduating from high school and completed 3 years of study at Syracuse University.
