Lavon Boswell, 71, a faithful servant of Christ, loving husband, father and grandfather, passed from this life to eternal life, unexpectedly on Tuesday, March 3, 2015.

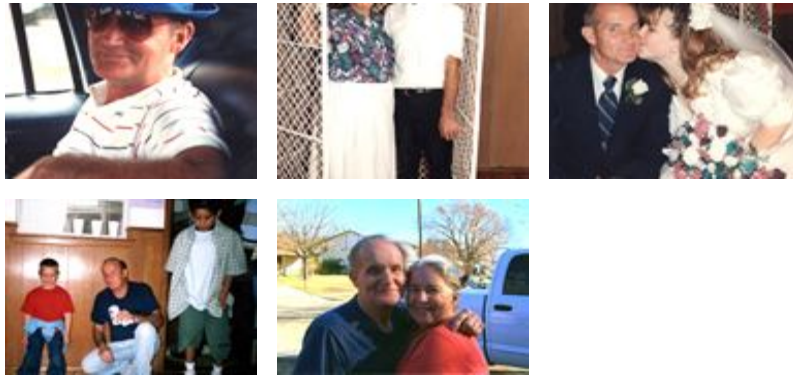


