Linda Madge Domangue, 65, died Friday, January 6, 2017. A visitation will be from 6 to 8 p.m. on Tuesday at the funeral home. Service will be 11 a.m. Wednesday in the funeral home chapel, with a graveside service at 10:30 a.m. Thursday at Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemetery.

Daughter, sister, wife, mother, friend, and mischievous cheater at most games she ever played, Linda Madge Long Domangue was born in Scott County, MS on June 17, 1951 in Morton MS. She died January 6, 2017 in Arlington, TX. She is survived by her husband James "Jim" Philip Domangue. She is the mother of Leah Madge Domangue (preceded in death), and was mother to David Domangue. She is also grandmother to Brittany Berry and Justin Domangue and great grandmother to Olivia Domangue. As a daughter Linda was ferociously independent, at times to a fault. She was diligent in helping her parents and valued their wisdom.

She let the person know that she would not abide her sibling's heart being broken. There are brothers and sisters-in-law of long tenure who can attest to this fact.

In her role as a wife, she was faithful to her vows, a great homemaker, financial stabilizer, and caretaker. Linda kept things organized, neat, and tidy. All of her bric-a-brac was in its place at all times. As the CFO of the house, dollars and dimes had equal importance. Her most vital role was to be Jim's friend and sounding board. She never failed to support or admonish him as she felt appropriate to remain faithful to her often idealistic vision of how their lives and marriage should be lived.

In the maternal role Linda was a mother who relentlessly questioned the doctors to understand the many treatment protocols to be followed to assure optimal success in the many treatments Leah was subjected to in her short life. She was equally relentless in being sure that all involved in Leah's care followed those protocols to the letter. Linda's first child was David, Jim's son. Never once did she refer to him as "step." She loved and cared for him no differently than her biological child.

Many are fortunate to have had Linda as a friend. As such, she was known to be straightforward, trustworthy, and loyal. Friends who remained such understood that if an opinion was asked for, the response would be unvarnished and to the point of the matter. Linda was trustworthy. A confidence was a solemn promise and would not be broken. Disagreement did not dissuade her loyalty. You might be in her "dog house" but if needed in a crisis that loyalty mitigated your transgression.

It is well known by family and friends that in marathon sessions of game playing that if you did not keep your cards, dominoes, etc. close to the vest she would sneak a peek. She would then use that information to lay down a complete hand, book or suit to win the game while everyone else at the table was still shuffling through and trying to make sense of their game pieces. Linda's presence, spirit, and yes, opinions will be missed immensely by her family and friends. Dear Linda, daughter, sister, wife, mother, friend and
