Pablo Aldaco Sustaita Jr., 61, loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend, died on Thursday, June 13, 2013 after a lengthy illness.

Pablo was born on May 22, 1952 in Grapevine, Texas, the son of the late Pablo Sustaita Sr., and the late Dominga Aldaco Sustaita. He was raised in Grapevine, overcoming dyslexia (undiagnosed in that period of time) where he would live until he met Lydia Tijerina. They would meet in June of 1975, he would propose to her in October and they would marry on January 15, 1976.

They would move to Grand Prairie where they would raise their children. He would work for Industrial Catering and would be known as a hard worker, always arriving at work early and working late in the day. He would continue working for them until health reasons would lead to his retirement at the age of 53.

He was never idle. Even after retirement, he would occupy his time by working on the property in Springtown, raising chickens or turkeys. He loved being outdoors, fishing or working on his 72 Stingray or his 64 Mercedes. Pablo loved his life, and loved providing for his family.
